

In 2003, KHPT was a small group of people on a mission to reduce HIV among high-risk populations in Karnataka. Their work took them to the heart of community, to people who had the seeds of ideas and the willpower to improve their health and well-being. KHPT worked alongside them to create local solutions: planning, implementing, modifying and monitoring them to create interventions with a solid foundation of evidence which could be adapted and applied around the world. These interventions made Karnataka a global learning site for HIV interventions and established KHPT as a community-oriented organization with a scientific approach to public health innovations.

Today, KHPT draws on its diverse team of development practitioners, medical professionals and experts in research, communications and advocacy, as well as a large team of dedicated field staff, to address complex issues of Tuberculosis, Adolescent Health, Maternal Neonatal and Child Health, and Comprehensive Primary Health Care.


