research for Immediate Kangaroo Mother Care (iKMC). This initiative was developed under the guidance from St. John's Medical College Hospital and supported by KHPT. The MNCU was inaugurated on December 4, by the Honorable Deputy Commissioner of Kolar, Shri Akram Pasha, in the presence other esteemed district dignitaries.

In regular Neonatal Intensive Care Units (NICUs), mothers and babies are often kept apart, which can prevent the mothers in starting KMC early. The MNCU solves this by keeping mothers and babies together from the start. This way, mothers can take care of their babies through feeding, holding them close (skin-to-skin), and breastfeeding, while also getting help to recover after birth.

KHPT exposure visit to Assam to explore Health and Nutrition Initiatives

The exposure visit to Assam on December 12 & 13, 2024, focused on understanding ITC's health and nutrition initiatives implemented through the Youth Invest Foundation (YIF) in collaboration with the State Women and Child Development (WCD) Department. The visit highlighted strategies for early childhood development (ECD) during the critical first 1,000 days and creating malnutrition-free villages through targeted nutrition counseling and improved ICDS efficiency. Discussions also explored broadening the scope of services beyond anemia to include undernutrition across the life cycle (0 to 35 years) and ECD (0 to 3 years), as well as expanding the initiative to additional blocks in Karnataka beyond the existing ones.

Organized by the Kangaroo Mother Care Foundation, India, in collaboration with the National Neonatology Forum, Karnataka Chapter, the workshop aimed to identify and address challenges in KMC implementation.

Our team joined group discussions on facilitybased and home-based KMC, sharing practical insights from our experiences in both rural and urban environments, contributing to a broader understanding of KMC implementation challenges. This workshop brought together representatives from civil society, academic institutions, researchers, and government

the Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR)-led Neonatal Mortality Reduction Implementation Project in Koppal district and highlighted the role of private hospitals in reducing neonatal and perinatal mortality. Key discussions focused on high-risk pregnancy management, newborn care, referral pathways, and leveraging programs like PMSMA and Ayushman Bharat - Arogya Karnataka to bridge healthcare gaps and improve neonatal outcomes.

KHPT Organizes Private Hospitals Engagement Program to Address Stillbirth Reduction in Haveri

In collaboration with the Indian Medical Association (IMA) Haveri, the Haveri Obstetrics and Gynaecology Society, and St. John's Research Institute, KHPT organized a Private Hospitals Engagement Program on December 11, 2024 at IMA Hall, Ranebennur. The primary objective of the event was to sensitize private practitioners about the ICMRled Stillbirth Reduction Research Project being conducted in the district and to explore opportunities for collaboration. The program was attended by around **20** obstetricians and gynecologists, and pediatricians practicing in private hospitals across Haveri and Ranebennur talukas. Dr. Rajnish Samal, Senior Consultant in Maternal and Fetal Medicine at Bangalore Baptist Hospital, delivered the keynote address. During his session, he discussed the burden, causes, evaluation, and management of stillbirths, as well as planning for future pregnancies. This event marks the first step towards a public-private partnership aimed at achieving the shared goal of reducing stillbirths in Haveri district.

·······Program Implementation

The project, "Supporting India's domestic ecosystem for provision of fortified oils while ensuring sustainability and quality-assurance," aims to combat malnutrition and anemia through large-scale food fortification by providing technical support for the fortification of edible oil.

KHPT has been actively engaged in food fortification initiatives to address malnutrition and anemia. With funding from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation (BMGF), KHPT will implement this project across seven states: Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat, Uttar Pradesh, Karnataka, Andhra Pradesh, Rajasthan, and Tamil Nadu. KHPT, with support from the Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR), is implementing a five-year research initiative in Chitradurga district, Karnataka, "First-1000-Days of Life: Implementation Research for a District Model of Care in Karnataka, India"

The project focuses on maternal care across all stages-preconception, pregnancy, childbirth, and postpartum-while also addressing neonatal mortality through targeted interventions for small and sick newborns. Special attention will be given to preterm birth, low birth weight, birth asphyxia and neonatal sepsis. Additionally, the initiative aims to improve early childhood neurodevelopmental outcomes. The research will design, implement, and evaluate a scalable district model aligned with India's Newborn Action Plan (INAP) targets for 2030.





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
